- We have educational licences for all training programs.




- •One of the biggest non-formal education centres in Estonia.
- •Our training courses allow adult students to develop their creativity, talents and social skills.
- About 6000 students per year.
- 15 full or part time employees.
- Over 160 trainers (hired by employment contracts).




Tartu is the second largest city in Estonia with 100 000 inhabitants.





Division according to the number of students and study hours



Tartu Folk High School EDUCATION PROJECT

'Estonian language instruction for the beneficiaries of international protection AMIF2017-8' 2018–2019 (European Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund AMIF and Ministry of Internal Affairs)

The project aims to provide 300 Estonian language classes per person for up to 150 beneficiaries of international protection in Estonia to acquire A2 language level knowledge.

400 000 euros







'Upgrading the learning, cooperation and communication competences in East, West and South Estonia' (PÕKSA) 2017–2019 (ESF, Innove)

The project aims to enhance the key competencies of grown-ups to develop and tune their learning mindset. The target group is people with little experience in life-long learning.

A 48-hour training is available in 11 counties (Tartu Folk High School with 8 other non-formal education centres). Includes trainings for instructors and other staff.

Support 273 400 euros.



48-hour training consists of 3 topics:

- 1.personal development needs (learning competence)
- 2.team work (social competence)
- 3.effective influencing (social competence).

Target groups – people, who:

- haven't studied long time
- have low salary
- don't have vocational education (no profession)
- are young parents
- are not working (unemployed, with special needs)







Tartu Folk High School EDUCATION PROJECT

'Developing communication, ICT and language competences in NON-formal adult education centres' 2018–2020 (ESF, Innove)

The project aims to enhance the key competencies of adults focussing to communication, ICT and language competence.

90 different trainings for 900 people in 12 counties. Partners are 7 non-formal education centres.

The target group is people with little experience in life-long learning.


Support 250 000 euros.
